

CURRICULUM SNAPSHOT

Year 4

Term 2 2025

English

Students engage with a variety of texts including informative texts of increasing complexity and technicality. Texts by Australian, including First Nations Australian, and world authors should extend students as independent readers.

Texts may be about topics of interest or topics being studied in other learning areas. They include text-specific language features, varied sentence structures and some unfamiliar vocabulary.

Students explore how characteristic features of texts and the specific

organisation of language serve the purpose of texts. Students use texts as models to create and present a report.





Maths

Prime Maths is a world class program based on topperforming schools in Singapore, Republic of Korea and Hong Kong. The program covers the six strands of mathematics: Number, Algebra, Measurement, Space, Statistics and Probability. It is aligned to the Australian Curriculum: Mathematics Version 9.

Science

Students will identify the roles of organisms in a habitat and construct food chains.
